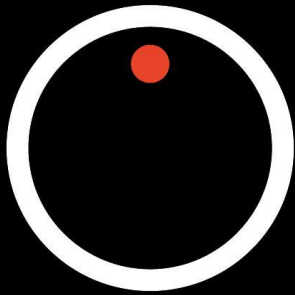




## BEBALI TEXTILES

Origin	- Banjar Kubuanyar, Desa Pacung, Tejakula, Buleleng, Bali (Bali North)
Type	- Shawl designed with Bebali pattern Bebali is a local design/pattern which is characterizing the area so as in Scotland different tartans are characterizing different clans Bebali designed textiles has two main functions: as everyday clothes they are used in their plain tracery by men and women as sarong (kamben) for daily wear; and ceremoniously used during cyclic seasonal rituals The Bebali lines symbolize the transition from one phase of life to another. (This products are coming from a project started in 2000. The aim of this project is to maintain and preserve the original and ancient local handcraft tradition and to develop the local economy, with the support of the whole community. Bebali textiles are created with a typical weaving process called Cagcag, using unique, old, rediscovered and restored balinese looms, moved and overated by the hands of expert and skilled local elderly women. Raw materials are grown naturally nearby the weavers family compound. Absolutely

only raw materials, as well, are used for dyeing: Indigo, Morinda Citrifolia,... leaves, bark, roots,... and so on.

Process	-	Dyed in natural color only and weaved so as above explained: handmade using ancient rediscovered and restored looms moved and operated by the hands of expert and skilled local elderly women
